Panthers QB Cam Newton and Colts LB D'Qwell Jackson Named Walter Camp All-America Alumni NFL Players of the Week

New Haven, CT - The Walter Camp Football Foundation has announced its All-America Alumni NFL Offensive and Defensive Players of the week for games ending November 23.

About the Award: *The Walter Camp Foundation has more than 300 of its All-American alumni currently on NFL rosters. The Foundation's All-America teams date back to 1889, and the Foundation has also selected a Second Team since 1998. Each week during the NFL regular-season, the Walter Camp Foundation will recognize one offensive and one defensive player as its Alumni Players of the Week.*

OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

CAM NEWTON, Quarterback, Carolina Panthers

Cam Newton completed 21-of-34 passes for 246 yards and five touchdowns as the Carolina Panthers remained unbeaten with a 44-16 victory over the Washington Redskins. A collegiate standout for the Auburn Tigers, Newton was the 2010 Walter Camp Player of the Year.

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

D'QWELL JACKSON, Linebacker, Indianapolis Colts

D'Qwell Jackson had seven tackles, one quarterback sack, one fumble recovery and one interception, which he returned six yards for a touchdown as the Indianapolis Colts defeated the Atlanta Falcons, 24-21. Jackson was a collegiate standout at the University of Maryland and earned Walter Camp Second Team All-America honors in 2005.

Walter Camp, "The Father of American football," first selected an All-America team in 1889. Camp – a former Yale University athlete and football coach – is also credited with developing play from scrimmage, set plays, the numerical assessment of goals and tries and the restriction of play to eleven men per side. The Walter Camp Football Foundation (www.waltercamp.org, @WalterCampFF) – a New Haven-based all-volunteer group – was founded in 1967 to perpetuate the ideals of Camp and to continue the tradition of selecting annually an All-America team. The Foundation is a member of the National College Football Awards Association (NCFAA). The NCFAA was founded in 1997 as a coalition of the major collegiate football awards to protect, preserve and enhance the integrity, influence and prestige of the game's predominant awards.
